Based upon constructive suggestions from four-year college coaches, pro scouts, parents and players, the following format will be used for the 2004 Fall All-Star game. All of the following is an attempt to give our student athletes the best opportunity to perform their skills with the greatest opportunity for exposure:

1. Please stress the importance of reporting in a timely manner with the proper equipment and attitude.
2. First-game (morning) players will report at 8 a.m. They will be issued numbered tee shirts, assigned to designated dugouts and be given the opportunity to stretch and warm-up before pre-game infield/outfield practice.

Please note: there will be no batting practice before the first game, but rather, batting practice will be held between games when all four teams will be given the opportunity to hit on the field.

3. Second-game (afternoon) players will report at noon. They will be issued numbered tee shirts, assigned to designated dugouts and be given the opportunity to stretch and warm-up and then, following completion of the first game, participate in batting practice.
4. Second-game players will then participate in infield/outfield practice before the second game.
5. Each pitcher will face four hitters, and this will constitute an inning. Each inning will be played as if there is always one out. (Changes were made from last-year's game format to accommodate additional pitchers and still complete the games before midnight)
6. Each hitter should get a minimum of two at-bats and, in most cases, three or four at-bats.
7. Each position players should get a minimum of three innings in the field and, in most cases, six to eight innings.

Note: The two major adjustments are BP between games and four hitters per pitcher.

All-star games provide a great opportunity for many players to gain needed exposure. Therefore, we encourage them to make the most of it by "hustling and busting their tail" when given the opportunity to perform.
